

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Know

You are responsible to comply with policies. You have access to the tenant handbook which clearly provides information.
Violations will be issued as well as possible evictions.

No excuses!

- Please review the Weapons and Firearms Policy- (included within this newsletter). You must disclose ownership and possession to PHHC. Come to the office for a form and register your items.
- DO NOT FEED the wildlife and cats. This is attracting rodents and skunks. No body wants a skunk to spray in the courtyards! <u>STOP!!!</u>
- You are responsible for your pets/animals. You must pick up after them, keep them on leashes, and be able to remove them during mandatory visits to your apartment! The staff will not be responsible for their care. Kitty litter boxes must be changed daily to avoid odors! PHHC will no longer provide cat carriers or assist with your pets!
- Tenants must <u>stop interrupting the staff</u> when they are on their breaks or while performing tasks. This is for their safety and a show of respect for their time. <u>DO NOT</u>: go into apartments while they are working, interrupt their breaks or meal time, and ABSOLUTELY DO NOT interrupt while they are operating equipment!!! Violations will be issued.
- Signs have been posted and violations will be issued for damage to elevators. The passenger only elevators are not to have wagons, wheel chairs, or power wheel chairs in them!
- Smoke in designated areas only. Safety concerns include starting a fire and/or affecting the health of others. These are just a few reasons why smoking is not allowed in your apartment or the building. This is an evictable offense. Don't chance being evicted!
